Directions to Discounted Parking at the Holiday Inn Select 5 Blossom Street, Boston, MA 02114

- From the Massachusetts Turnpike (I-90): Take exit 18 (Brighton/Cambridge). This will be a left exit. After the tollbooths, stay in the right lane (Cambridge/Somerville). Make a right at the 1st traffic light. (Downtown Boston/Storrow Drive). Travel 3 miles on Storrow Drive to the Government Center/Downtown Exit. Upon exiting, go straight through the traffic light and onto Cambridge Street. Turn left at the 2<sup>nd</sup> traffic light. (Blossom Street). The Holiday Inn Select will be on your right.
- From 93 South and 95 South (NH, ME, VT) Take 95 South to 93 South. Take exit 26 Storrow Drive (Storrow Drive/Cambridge). Stay in the far right lane. Follow signs to Back Bay/Storrow Drive.
