

## DIRECTIONS

**Embassy Suites  
550 Winter Street

### From Boston

Travel west on the Massachusetts Turnpike/I-90 to Exit 15-A (Providence RI/Waltham). Merge onto I-95N/MA 128N. Take Exit 27A-B (Totten Pond Road/Third Ave). Keep left, take ramp toward Winter Street/Totten Pond Road. Merge onto Wyman Street, bearing right onto Winter Street. Stay in middle lane to make left turn at the traffic light onto First Avenue. Turn left into the hotel parking lot. Embassy Suites is located at the corner of First Avenue and Winter Street.

### From Points West

Travel east on the Massachusetts Turnpike/I-90 to Exit 14 (South Shore/NH-Maine). Follow signs for I-95N/128 N. Take Exit 27A-B (Totten Pond Road/Third Ave). Keep left, take ramp toward Winter Street/Totten Pond Road. Merge onto Wyman Street, bearing right onto Winter Street. Stay in middle lane to make left turn at the traffic light onto First Avenue. Turn left into the hotel parking lot. Embassy Suites is located at the corner of First Avenue and Winter Street.

### From Points North

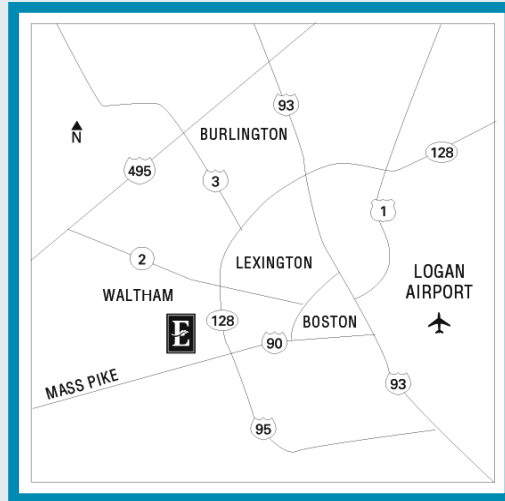
Travel south on I-95/MA 128 N to Exit 27B (Winter Street). Stay straight/bear right to go onto Winter Street. Stay in middle lane to make a left turn at the traffic light onto First Avenue. Turn left into the hotel parking lot. Embassy Suites is located at the corner of First Avenue and Winter Streets.

### From Points South

From I-95N/MA 128N, take Exit 27A-B (Totten Pond Road/Third Ave). Keep left, take ramp toward Winter Street/Totten Pond Road. Merge onto Wyman Street, bearing right onto Winter Street.
