DIRECTIONS AND PARKING

Driving Directions

• From the South

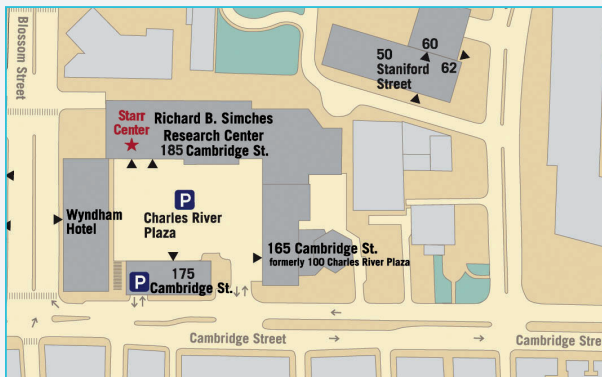
Take I-93 to Exit 26 (Storrow Drive). Follow the signs to Storrow Drive. Take Storrow Drive West to Government Center exit (left exit). Turn left onto Cambridge Street at the next traffic signal. Charles River Plaza will be on your left just past Blossom Street.

• From the North

Take Route 1 South over Tobin Bridge. Follow signs to Storrow Drive (stay left). Take Storrow Drive West to Government Center exit (left exit). At end of the ramp, proceed straight under the train tracks. Turn left onto Cambridge Street at the next traffic signal. Take Cambridge St toward Government Center, just past Blossom Street. The Charles River Plaza will be on your left.

• From the West

Take I-90 East to Exit 18 (Cambridge/Allston/Brighton). Bear right after the toll booth. Turn right at the first set of lights onto Storrow Drive East-bound to Downtown Boston. Approximately five miles, take Storrow Drive East to Government Center (Cambridge Street). Proceed along Cambridge Street for two sets of lights, just past Blossom Street. The Charles River Plaza will be on your left.



Public Transportation (MBTA)

• RED LINE to Charles Street

Walk along Cambridge Street toward Government Center. Charles River Plaza is on your left.

• BLUE LINE to Bowdoin Street

Walk along Cambridge Street toward Charles River. Charles River Plaza is on your right.

• GREEN/ORANGE LINE to North Station

Walk along Causeway Street (keeping the TD Garden on your right). Continue straight until you reach Staniford Street. Continue along Staniford Street for two blocks. Turn right onto Cardinal O'Connell Way. On the left side of the street, the sidewalk leads to a tunnel connecting to Charles River Plaza.

Parking

All parking is privately owned. There are no discounts.

Parking is available on the upper deck or underground of Charles River Plaza (second driveway on the right. Estimated at \$48.00). Optional parking is available at the Staniford Street Garage at 50/62 Staniford Street. No cash is accepted. (Parking is approximately \$31.00.) Note: Parking rates are subject to change
