DIRECTIONS*

From South of Boston

Take I-93 North to Exit 26 (Cambridge/Storrow Drive). Keep left at the end of ramp and take underpass to Storrow Drive. Follow Storrow Drive approximately two-and-a-half miles to Kenmore Square exit (on left). Bear right at end of exit ramp into Kenmore Square. Take leftmost fork at intersection onto Brookline Avenue. Follow Brookline Avenue approximately one mile (Beth Israel Hospital will be on the left) until Longwood Avenue. Take left on to Longwood Avenue and follow approximately one-quarter mile. Turn left onto Avenue Louis Pasteur. Glass building is on the left.

From West of Boston

Take I-90 East (Massachusetts Turnpike) to Exit 18 (Cambridge/Allston). Bear right after toll booth at end of exit ramp. Turn right after lights (before the bridge) onto Storrow Drive. Follow Storrow Drive (about one mile) to Kenmore Square exit. Bear right at end of exit ramp into Kenmore Square. Take leftmost fork at intersection onto Brookline Avenue. Follow Brookline Avenue approximately one mile (Beth Israel Hospital will be on the left) until Longwood Avenue. Take left on Longwood Avenue and follow approximately one-quarter mile. Turn left onto Avenue Louis Pasteur. Glass building is on the left.

From North of Boston

Take I-93 South to Exit 26 (Storrow Drive/North Station). Keep left at end of ramp and take underpass to Storrow Drive. Follow Storrow Drive approximately two-and-a-half miles to Kenmore Square exit (on left). Bear right at end of exit ramp into Kenmore Square. Take leftmost fork at intersection onto Brookline Avenue. Follow Brookline Avenue approximately one mile (Beth Israel Hospital will be on the left) until Longwood Avenue. Take left on Longwood Avenue and follow approximately one-quarter mile. Turn left onto Avenue Louis Pasteur. Glass building is on the left.
