DIRECTIONS AND PARKING

Directions to Albert Sherman Center

- From the East**

Take the Massachusetts Turnpike (Route 90) West to Exit 11 (Route 122). Take a left off the exit ramp onto Route 122 North (Grafton Street). At the intersection with Sunderland Road, take a right. At the first set of lights on Sunderland Road, take a left onto Lake Avenue and proceed for two-and-a-half miles. Get into the left lane at the intersection of Route 9 (Mr. Tux will be on left) and turn left. Get into the right lane. Turn right at the traffic light onto Plantation Street. At second set of lights turn right onto North Road. Albert Sherman Center is on the right.

Or: Take the Massachusetts Turnpike (Route 90) West to Exit 10. Take I-290 East to Exit 21. Turn right off exit onto Plantation Street. Go to second traffic light. Take left onto North Road. Albert Sherman Center is on the right.

- From the West**

Take the Massachusetts Turnpike East to Exit 10 (I-290 East). Take I-290 to Exit 21. Turn right off exit onto Plantation Street. Go to second traffic light. Take left onto North Road. Albert Sherman Center is on the right.

- From the North**

Take I-495 South to Exit 25B (I-290 West). From I-290 West, take Exit 22, and turn right off exit. At second traffic light, turn left onto Plantation Street. Go to third traffic light. Take left onto North Road. Albert Sherman Center is on the right.

Or: Take I-190 South; follow signs for I-290 East to Exit 21. Turn right off exit onto Plantation Street. Go to second traffic light. Take left onto North Road. Albert Sherman Center is on the right.

- From the South**

Take I-495 North to Exit 25B (I-290 West). From I-290 West, take Exit 22 and turn right off exit. At second traffic light, turn left onto Plantation Street. Go to third traffic light. Take left onto North Road. Albert Sherman Center is on the right.

Or: Take I-395 North to where it becomes I-290 East. Take I-290 to Exit 21. Turn right off exit onto Plantation Street. Go to second traffic light. Take left onto North Road. Albert Sherman Center is on the right.

Or: Take Route 146 North to I-290 East to Exit 21. Turn right off exit onto Plantation Street. Go to second traffic light. Take left onto North Road. Albert Sherman Center is on the right.

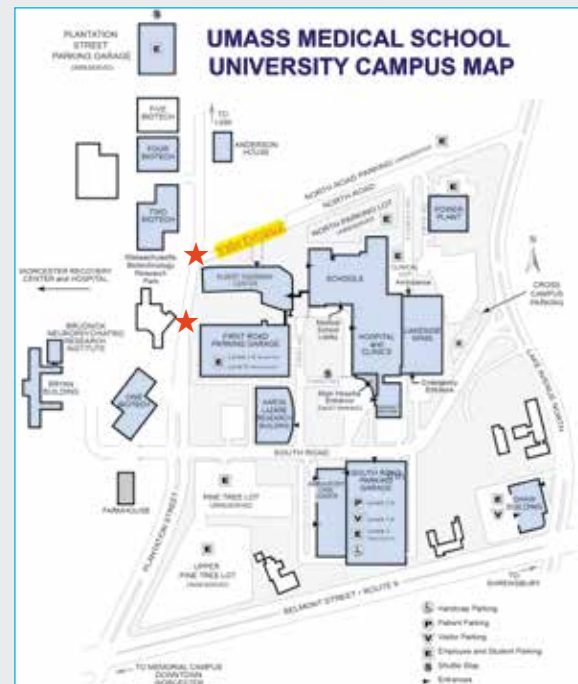
Parking and Walking Directions
